Our 41st season begins with the return of celebrated violinist Movses Pogossian in Mendelssohn's lyrical Violin Concerto in E minor. The program also includes Mendelssohn's beloved Overture to "A Midsummer Night's Dream" and Beethoven's ebullient Symphony No. 2 in D Major.



#### NOV 7, 2025 – 8PM RAEHANN BRYCE-DAVIS – OPERATIC FIREWORKS

Fresh off of triumphant appearances at Houston Grand Opera, Santa Fe Opera, Dutch Opera and the Metropolitan Opera, Raehann Bryce-Davis returns to the intimate St. Matthew's Church for a selection of operatic arias by Verdi, Dvořák, and Saint-Saëns plus a selection of soulful spirituals.



#### DEC 5, 2025 - 7:30PM BACH COLLEGIUM SAN DIEGO PRESENTS HANDEL'S "MESSIAH"

Conductor Ruben Valenzuela brings a complete performance of Handel's immortal holiday classic featuring some of the best early-music instrumentalists and singers from around the country.





#### FEB 6, 2026 - 8PM The Gesualdo Six — "Queen of Hearts"

Drawing from motets and chansons from the courts of Anne of Brittany, Margaret of Austria, Anne Boleyn and Mary Tudor, the Gesualdo Six have been described as "weavers of rich and plangent aural tapestries [melding] style and substance with beguiling sure-footedness." – BBC Music Magazine



#### APR 24, 2026 – 8PM DAVID GARRETT, HAYDN, AND "A CLASSICAL JOURNEY"

David Garrett, a member of the LA Phil's cello section since 2000, plays Haydn's Cello Concerto in D major. The program takes us on a journey through musical classicism, visiting works by CPE Bach, Schubert and von Weber.

Organist Nathan Laube, recognized as one of the finest organists of his generation, joins us to celebrate the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the C.B. Fisk organ at St. Matthew's Church (postponed from May 2025).



#### MAY 29, 2026 – 8PM SEASON FINALE – YUEUN GEMMA KIM PLAYS DVORAK

Concertmaster YuEun Kim steps front and center for Antonin DvořáKs lush Violin Concerto in A minor. Also featured on the program is the premiere of the latest SMMG commission, Maria Eugenia León's newest work, Raices (Roots), which evokes the sights and sounds of her native Canary Islands.



#### MAR 20, 2026 – 8PM ALLAKHVERDYAN AND CROCKETT PLAY STRAUSS

LA Phil principals Boris Allakhverdyan and Whitney Crockett join the Chamber Orchestra for one of Richard Strauss's most beautiful and soulful late works, the "Duet-Concertino for Clarinet and Bassoon." Music of Tchaikovsky and David Lefkowitz (pictured) is also featured.

the evening is "Zachor" ("Remembrance"), by Los Angeles-based composer David Lefkowitz, a work which reveals an old Lithuanian Klezmer tune emerging from the distant past. Tchaikovsky's lushly orchestrated "Serenade for Strings" rounds out the program.

Our season finale features music quaranteed to lift your spirits. Opening with Maurice Ravel's orchestration of Claude Debussy's lighthearted "Danse" ("Tarantella Styrienne"), the Chamber Orchestra premieres the Music Guild's latest commissioned work by Los Angeles-based composer, María Eugenia León. Highlighting the musical traditions of both her native Canary Islands as well as Spain, "Raíces" ("Roots") features the timple, a five-string guitar described as "the pinnacle of Canarian music." The evening concludes with Dvořák's lush Violin Concerto in A minor, featuring our Concertmaster YuEun Gemma Kim.

# **OUR COMMUNITY CONCERTS**

The Music Guild presented over 35 live Community Concerts during the 2024-25 season and we are planning even more for our 41st season. Performance venues include centers operated by LA Family Housing throughout the San Fernando Valley and three Union Rescue Mission sites. We were warmly welcomed at the Union Rescue Mission's annual downtown Thanksgiving celebration, where we performed for more than 400 people over two lunch sittings. In addition, we have been particularly touched by the reception we continue to receive at The Arroyo, a women-only facility where we sponsor performances by female ensembles. We also perform regularly at the Neighborhood Youth Association and every first Thursday of the month at Bread & Roses Café in Venice.

We present keyboardists, guitarists, singers, woodwind, string and brass ensembles, mariachi bands, jazz ensembles, R&B artists, and others from the folk and pop worlds. Featured performers include members of The Chamber Orchestra at St. Matthew's, Adelaide Bienvenides, Lorenzo Sanchez, Spencer Artwick, Stephanie Amaro, and jazz artists

Kirsten Edkins, Amy Rowe, Jocelyn Scofield and Alena Bernardi. Recently, following a performance at the Arroyo, Kirsten Edkins, one of Los Angeles's most prominent jazz Saxophonists, wrote, "I have had many high-profile gigs (from Lady Gaga...to Tom Hanks, Cher, Sophia Loren, and many other stars). The concerts at the Arroyo have meant as much if not more than all the others. To play for these women who have been through hell, are hurting, and on their way to starting a new life means the world to me. Thank you for the opportunity!"


